Every child starts at their own stage. This pathway shows how we'll build their reading and writing step by step — helping them grow with confidence.

Children work through each stage in 5-week blocks, with a quick check at the end to see what they've mastered and whether they're ready to move on or



🌱 Kākano (Seed)



(Typically learnt by the end of Year 1)

- Short vowels: a, e, i, o, u
- **Consonants**: m, d, t, s, p, n, k, c, h, r, b, f, l, g, w, j, v, y, z, x
- Consonant digraphs: ck, th, sh, ch, ng



Tupu (Seedling)



(Typically learnt by the end of Year 2)

- Double consonants (Floss rule): ff, II, ss, zz,
- Consonant digraphs & trigraphs- x, qu, wh, -tch, -dge
- Beginning Blends: st, sp, cl, tr
- End blends: st ld lk mp nt sk nk
- Long vowels (split digraphs): a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e, u-e
- **Alternative spellings**: soft c (cent), oo (food/look)

Māhuri (Sapling)



(Typically learnt by the end of Year 3)

- Suffixes: -ing, -ed, -s, -es (plurals & verb endings)
- Long vowels: ay, ai, ee, ea, igh, oa, ow, oe, ew, ue
- R-controlled vowels:- ar, or, er, ir, ur, ear, air, ere
- Diphthongs: oi, oy, ou, ow
- Alternative spellings: ea (bread), igh (night), ph (phone), -ge (bridge)



🌲 Rākau (Tree)



(Typically learnt by the end of Year 4-6)

- Contractions: I'm, can't, we'll, she's, they'll
- Multisyllabic words: Using known phonics patterns to read longer words (e.g. sunset, fantastic)
- Prefixes & suffixes: re-, un-, -est, -ly
- Further vowel & consonant patterns: eigh (eight), kn (know), gh (ghost), oar (roar), ore (more)

These year levels are a guide only. Every child moves at their own pace, and I adjust groups to match their needs.
